No compulsory clarification meeting will be held.

The completed Bid documents must be placed in a sealed envelope, clearly marked with the BID NO: SCMU 10 -20/21-0013 and full description, APPOINTMENT OF A PANEL OF SERVICE PROVIDERS FOR MEDICAL SURVEILANCE FOR INHOUSE TEAMS FOR 36 MONTHS. required, and may be deposited in the Bid Box situated at Department of Transport, 32 Cowen Close, Old Building, Stellenbosch Park, C Block Foyer, King Williams Town, 5601, not later than 11H00 on the 23 July 2021 when the bids will be opened in public.

It is the responsibility of the tenderer/s to ensure that bid documents / proposals are submitted on or before closing time and the correct location, as the Department will not take responsibility of wrong delivery. Tenderers using courier services for delivery of their bid documents must ensure the delivery is at the correct place / location and time as the Department will not be held responsible for wrong delivery.

Bidders must take particular note of the following:

- Bids will be evaluated based on the 80/20 preference point system in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (Act 5 of 2000) and 2017 Regulations thereto and points for B-BBEE status.
- Bidders are required to submit an original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or Sworn Affidavits in the case of an Exempted Micro Enterprises [EME] or certified copies thereof together with their bids to substantiate their B-BBEE rating claims.
- NB: Bidders who do not possess the B-BBEE status verification certificate will not qualify to claim points for B-BBEE status level of contributor, only points for price will be considered.
- Bidders must submit a Centralized Suppliers Database (CSD) Registration Report with the Bid
 as proof of being registered on the Database, and failure to do so will render the bid nonresponsive, and will be disqualified, such report must be within ten [10] days on the closing
 date of the bid.
- Bidders must also submit a Tax Compliance Status PIN code in order to verify their tax status with SARS
- The lowest / any bid will not necessarily be accepted.
- Failure to comply will render the bid non-responsive.

SECTION 2: BID CONDITIONS

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

The General Conditions of Contract given in Section 3 and the Department's Policy on Supply Chain Management shall apply to this contract.

2. BID FORM

All bids shall be made on the bid forms incorporated in this document.

3. EVIDENCE OF EXPERIENCE OF BIDDERS

Bidders shall give satisfactory evidence of actual experience in the class of work being bid for, Appointment of a Panel of Service Providers for Medical Surveillance for In-House Teams for Thirty-Six (36) months, incorporating the following details:

Employer for whom the work was performed;

Nature of work;

Value of work;

Year completed.

Recommendation / reference letter from previous work completed.

Failure to complete this statement may prejudice the bid as being submitted by an inexperienced Bidder and it may be rejected for such reason.

4. COMPLETION OF BIDS

The Bidder shall complete all forms in black ink.

Mistakes made by the Bidder in the completion of the forms shall not be erased. A line shall be drawn through the incorrect entry and the correct entry shall be written above and the correction initialed by the Bidder. Failure to observe this rule may lead to the bid being disgualified.

Bids shall be ineligible for consideration unless submitted on the forms bound in this document.

A bid shall not be considered if alterations have been made to the bid from, unless such alterations have been duly authenticated by the Bidder, or of any particulars required therein have not been completed in all respects.

No unauthorized amendment shall be made to the bid form or to any other part of the bid document. If any such amendments are made, the bid may be rejected.

Bids submitted in accordance with this bid document shall not have any qualifications. Any point of difficulty of interpretation shall be cleared with the Eastern Cape Department of Transport as early as possible during the bid period. Should any query be found to be of significance, The Eastern Cape Department of Transport will inform all Bidders accordingly as early as possible.

5. SUBMISSION OF BIDS

Each Bidder is required to return the complete set of bid documents with all the required information and complete in all respects.

Bidders shall not tamper with the bid documents which shall be submitted as issued. Any bid documents found to have been unbound and rebound could be deemed to be unacceptable.

Bids, in sealed envelope clearly marked

and the Bidder's name and address, shall be deposited in the Bid Box situated at C Block Foyer, Old Stellenbosch Park Building, Department of Transport, Flemming Street, King William's town, 5601, not later than 11H00 on 23 July 2021 Bids may not be faxed or e-mailed. Bids shall be opened in public shortly thereafter. Late bids shall be rejected.

6. DATA TO BE FURNISHED AT BID STAGE

Bidders shall submit with their bids the information that is applicable and as may be required in terms of the specifications and Functionality. The Employer reserves the right, in the event of such details being insufficient, to call for further information. The Bidder shall furnish such additional information within seven (7) days of being called upon to do so.

7. WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

A Bidder may, without incurring any liability, withdraw his bid. This will be a written advice and received before the date and time of closure of this bid. The Eastern Cape Department of Transport, before the closure of this bid, must receive the notice.

8. COSTS WHICH DEFAULTING BIDDERS MAY BE CALLED UPON TO PAY

Should the Service Provider, after he has been notified of the acceptance of his bid, fail to enter into a contract when called upon to do so, within the period stipulated in the conditions of bid or within such extended period as the Employer may allow, the Service Provider holds himself liable for any additional expense which may incur in having to call for bids afresh and/or in having to accept any less favorable bid and that if he purports to withdraw his bid within the period for which he has agreed that it shall remain open for acceptance.

The Service Provider shall indemnify the specified from any claim capable of being made against him either under the statute of common law in respect of any damage to any person or property arising out of the execution of this contract.

9. MINIMUM WAGES

Any bid that contains proposals for wages that are less than the minimum wage according to sector Determination shall be rejected. Firm price for a period of three years including employee increments.

10. ACCEPTANCE OR REJECTION OF BIDS

Bids may be rejected if they show any additional items not originally included in the bid document. Conditional or incomplete offers, irregularities of any kind in the bid forms, or if the bid rates and amounts are obviously unbalanced and the Bidder, after having been called upon to adjust same in a reasonable manner, fails to do so within a period of seven (7) days having received notification to that effect.

The Employer does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any bid and reserves the right to accept the whole or any part of a bid as it may deem expedient, nor will it assign any reason for the acceptance or rejection of any bid, be it the whole or part of a bid.

11. SITE INSPECTION/BIDDERS MEETING

There will be no site inspection / bidders meeting.

12. FAILURE TO RETURN BID DOCUMENTS

A Bidder who does not submit a bid does not have to return the bid documents after the closing date for the receipt of bids.

13. TAXES AND LEVIES

Bidders shall include Value Added Tax (VAT) in their bid rates.

14. EVALUATION OF BIDS

Bids will be evaluated based in three (3) stages as follows:

Stage One: Compliance, responsiveness to minimum requirements and the bid rules and

Stage Two: Functionality and

Stage Three: Price based on the 80/20 preference point system in terms of the Preferential

80 points will be awarded to the bidder submitting the lowest price (all other bidders will receive points proportionately thereto):

Calculation of points for B-BBEE status level of contribution

Points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contributor in accordance with the table below.

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A bid will not be disqualified from the bidding process if the bidder does not submit a certificate substantiating the B-BBEE status level of contribution or is a non-compliant contributor. Such a bidder will score zero (0) out of the 20 points available for the B-BBEE status

15. BID VALIDITY PERIOD

Bids must remain valid for a period of NINETY (90) days from the closing date of the bid.

16. ACCEPTANCE OF BID

The Department does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any bid received and reserves the right to accept the whole or part of the bid.

17. PENALTIES

In the event that the Contractor fails to produce registers as specified in Chapter 4 "Project Specification", the Employer may deduct 5% of the invoice amount.

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SECTION 4: TERMS OF REFERENCE

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE MAINTENANCE TO AERONAUTICAL GROUND LIGHTING SYSTEMS AT MTHATHA AIRPORT

1. Purpose

The Department of Transport intends to appoint a reputable service provider(s) to render the Occupational Medical Surveillance for In-House Teams for Thirty-Six (36) months.

2. Background

In-house Construction and Maintenance units of the Department of Transport are mandated to upgrade, maintain and rehabilitate Eastern Cape roads using Departmental resources (plant & personnel).

According to the Occupational Health and Safety Act (85 of 1993) and it Construction Regulations of 2014, an employer has a legal obligation to ensure that employees are safe and healthy at all times whilst performing their duties. Transport infrastructure programme in compliance with the Act ensures that periodic examinations which include clinical examinations, biological monitoring by a registered occupational health practitioner are conducted annually.

3. Scope of Work

The main deliverables of the Service Provider is as follows:

- 3.1. To carry out Occupational Medical Surveillance for Departmental employees (Permanent and Local Labour) by Registered Occupational Health Practitioners, the tests are but not limited to the following:
 - Chest X Rays
 - GeneXPERT
 - SPT / Lung Function
 - Blood Tests
 - Audiometry
 - HIV / Aids
 - DVS Vision Screening
 - COVID 19
 - And any other occupational tests required as may be advised by the Employer Agent.
- 3.1.1. Conduct Annual Entry & Exit Medicals for Local labourers
- 3.1.2. Conduct Periodic Medical Examinations for permanent employees
- 3.1.3. Conduct HIRA for all In-House units (Construction & Maintenance)
- 3.1.4. Provide inputs in development of Medical Surveillance policy draft of the Department.
- 3.1.5. Conduct one-on-one consultations.
- 3.1.6. Complete and Submit Annual Medical Report as may be required by the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy.

3.2. Who conducts Occupational Medicals:

- Occupational Health Practitioner (OHP)
- Occupational Medicine Practitioner (OMP)

3.3. Ethical guideline for Practitioners:

- South African Society of Occupational Health Nurses (SASOHN)
- South African Society of Occupational Medicine (SOSOM)
- International Code of Ethics for Occupational Health (ICOH)

4. Service Level Agreement

It is recorded that the Employer and the service provider may from time to time agree in writing to additional quality requirements and standards relating to the Services together with performance measurement provisions, which quality requirements, performance measurement provisions shall be reduced to writing in a service level agreement and signed by both parties.

5. Breach and Termination

Bidders are referred to General Conditions of Contract (GCC) relating to failure to comply with conditions of this contract and delayed execution.

6. Loss and Damage

Service Provider / Bidder hereby indemnifies the State/Employer/Institution and will hold the State harmless/Employer/institution, against any loss or damages which the State may suffer, or any claims lodged against the State by any third party arising out of or relating to any loss that the State or such third party may suffer as a result of, or arising out of any act or omission of any personnel of contractor or the failure of contractor to provide the Services in accordance with the provisions of the contract.

7. Transfer Management

Upon termination of the contract for whatever reason contractor shall assist the Employer to transfer the Services to the Employer, or to another service provider designated by the Employer. Without detracting from the generality of this obligation, contractor shall, to the extent required by the Employer, provide the Employer or the third party service provider with all information and documentation required to enable the Employer or such service provider to provide the Services, it being recorded that this obligation shall not oblige contractor to deliver any documentation which is proprietary or confidential to contractor.

8. Sub-Contractors

The contractor may only sub-contract its obligations under the contract with the prior written consent of the Employer (or any other authorized authority) and then only to a person and to the extent approved by the Employer or such authority and upon such terms and conditions as the Employer or such authority require. It is recorded that where such consent is given the contractor shall remain liable to Employer for the performance of the Services.

9. Strikes

The Contractor undertakes that strikes by his personnel will not influence the rendering of this service.

10. Minimum Requirements

✓ Occupational Medical Practice – The Medical Practice must be registered with either of the following Professional bodies:

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- (a) SASOHN (South African Society of occupation health nurses) or
- (b) SOSOM (South African Society of occupation medicine) or
- (c) ICOH (International Code of Ethics for occupational health) or
- (d) HPCSA (Health Professional Council of South Africa
- ✓ Key personnel All key personnel must be registered Occupational Health Practitioners.
 - CV with valid registration certificates must be attached for Occupational Doctor & Nurses
- ✓ The company past experience in relation to the scope of work; Bidders shall give satisfactory evidence of actual experience in the class of work being bid for, incorporating the following details: The bid award letter / signed contract must provide for the following information and must be in the client's letterheads.
 - Nature of work;
 - Duration of the contract;
 - Value of work;
 - Year completed
- ✓ Provide proof of physical address for the office establishment (CSD primary address will be used)

11. Duration of The Project

The term of the project will be thirty-six (36) months from the date of acceptance of the award/purchase order, after which, the bidder shall be assigned a project.

12. Validity of BID

The validity of the offer is Ninety (90) days.

13. General conditions of Contract

The latest general conditions of contract law will apply.

Where special conditions of the contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

14. Special Conditions of Contract

a. Conditions of Contract

- (a) Service provider (practice) must be registered with relevant professional medical body (HPCSA -Health Professional Council of South Africa, etc.), failure to provide proof will render the bid nonresponsive.
- (b) Medical practitioner and his or her employees (Occupational Health Practitioners) must be registered with the relevant professional medical body (i.e. HPCSA Health Professional Council of South Africa, etc.), failure to provide proof will render the bid non-responsive.
- (c) The Tenderers will be required to submit a **valid** Letter of Good Standing from the Compensation Commissioner or FEMA.

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- (d) The ceiling price of the bid to be completed on the Pricing Schedule form must reflect all costs including VAT and disbursements.
- (e) No late, faxed, electronically transmitted, photocopied, incomplete, copies or unsigned bids will be accepted. Only original bids fully completed and filled in black ink will be accepted.
- (f) It is critical for service providers to fully present the credentials of key personnel to be assigned to projects.
- (g) The Department shall not enter into a contract where a company has directors, partners or employees who are employed by the state where permission has not been granted by the Executive Authority.
- (h) All documents submitted and/or produced shall become the property of the DOT.
- (i) The service provider undertakes to provide the professional resources required to attain the project objectives.
- (j) Service Providers who have entered into a consortium / Joint Venture must attach signed agreements by all partners and each party thereto must comply with all the bidding requirements.
- (k) Bidders are requested to submit one envelope marked on the outside indicating the name of the bidding company (Bidder) and the bid number;
- (I) The overall price must be in **Rand** and must be inclusive of VAT where applicable;
- (m) The selected service provider will have to sign a Service Level Agreement and SBD 7.2 contract form with the Department of Transport immediately upon acceptance of the bid.
- (n) The service provider undertakes to act as an independent contractor in respect of all work to be done.
- (o) The service provider shall, in all professional matters, act as a faithful adviser to the DOT and, in so far as any of its duties being discretionary, act fairly between DOT and third parties;
- (p) The service provider shall execute and complete the work strictly in accordance with this contract to the satisfaction of the DOT:
- (q) The service provider shall be deemed to have satisfied itself as to the correctness and sufficiency of the rates and prices set out in the contract for the work to be rendered;
- (r) The service provider shall not have the power or authority to enter into any contract or otherwise to bind or incur any liability on behalf of the DOT;
- (s) B-BBEE level certificate must be provided where necessary (Original document or original certified copy)
- (t) Joint ventures or Consortiums must submit a consolidated BBBEE level Certificate / sworn affidavit.

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- (u) The service provider must be registered in the Centralised Supplier Database (CSD); The CSD registration report must have been printed at least ten (10) days prior the closing date of the bid
- (v) It's the responsibility of every bidder to provide the Department with a SARS "PIN" to verify the tax compliance status at any time prior to the award of the bid.
- (w) DOT will not be liable to reimburse any costs incurred by any service provider during the proposal /bidding process;
- (x) The service provider shall attend meetings with officials whenever required to do so by the representative for the purpose of obtaining information or advice in regard to the work and assignments or any matters arising thereof;
- (y) Replacement of candidates for this assignment will not be allowed except in extreme cases and the new candidates must possess the same educational and training qualifications or higher than that of the predecessor which will be agreed upon in writing between the service provider and the Department.
- (z) All the submitted documents must be completed in full and signed where necessary.
- (aa)In cases where two or more bidders attain equal number of points in all aspects of evaluation, the bidder who has the highest B-BBEE points will be the preferred bidder.
- (bb)If two or more bidders attain equal number of points and preference points for B-BBEE, the bidder who has the highest points for functionality will be the preferred bidder.
- (cc) In cases where there is a tie in all aspects of evaluation then the award must be decided by the drawing of lots.
- (dd)Failure to submit the documentation as prescribed may lead to the bid being considered non-responsive and subsequently rejected / not considered.

15. Evaluation Criteria

- Bids will be evaluated on a 80/20 point system within the ambit of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) No.5 of 2000 and section 38(1)(a)(iii) of the Public Finance Management Act 1 of 1999 as amended by Act NO.29 of 1999 and Preference Procurement Regulations 2017;
- The evaluation will be carried out in Three stages, namely, "Compliance", "functionality" and "price and BBBEE points". Bidders are requested to submit one envelope
- Functionality will be evaluated separately to determine the responsiveness of the bids. The
 minimum qualifying percentage that will be accepted for functionality is 60%. A bidder who
 does not obtain a minimum of 60% will be disqualified;
- The final score will be obtained by adding points obtained for price to the preference points;

NB: Points score will be rounded to the nearest two (2) decimals

Functionality

Ps = So * Ap

Ms

Where

Ps = Points scored for functionality by bid/proposal under consideration

So = Score of the bid under consideration

Ms = Maximum possible scored.

Ap = Percentage allocated for functionality.

- Bidders score on functionality will not be included in the final points scored but determined to establish functionality abilities.
- The percentages allocated by all panel members must be added together and divided by the number of panel members to establish the average percentage obtained by each individual bidder for functionality;
- > The minimum qualifying percentage that will be accepted for functionality is 60%;
- Bids/proposal that do not score the specified minimum percentage for functionality will be disqualified.

16. Awarding of Points for Functionality and Price

Functionality

Please note bidders who do not make the minimum Functionality points shall not be evaluated for Price & BBBEE points.

a) **Functionality**: Bid offers will only be considered responsive if a minimum Functionality requirement of 60% is achieved.

Functionality (Max = 55 points)

Bidders are required to demonstrate their ability to undertake the work and provide proof of previous experience, expertise and availability of equipment to undertake a project of this nature. Bidders are

therefore required to meet a minimum Functionality Score of 60% (33 points out of 55 points) based on the criteria listed below. A score of less than 33 out of 55 points for Functionality will render the BID non responsive. The onus rests with the Bidder to supply sufficient information to allow for evaluation and award of points detailed below.

If insufficient information is provided, zero points will be awarded for that particular item.

<u>Note</u> that functionality points are only used to determine responsiveness and will not be used further in the evaluation.

The bidder is expected to score a minimum of 33 points out of the total Functionality points of 55 to be able to move to the next stage of Evaluation (Price Points & BBBEE)

17. Preferential Claims

Points scored for specified goals as contemplated by the PPPFA and its regulations are then calculated separately and added to the points scored for price to obtain the final score.

18. Specified Goals

Calculation of points for BBBEE status level of contributor will be allocated in the following manner

The points scored for price must be added to the points scored for BBBEE status level of contribution to obtain the bidder's total points scored out of 100.

In the event that two or more bids have equal total points, the successful bid will be the one with the highest points for BBBEE.

In the event that two or more bids are equal in all respects, the successful bidder will be the one with the highest functionality percentage and the last option will be the drawing of lots.

19. Compulsory Briefing & Closing Date

There will be no site inspection / bidders meeting.
