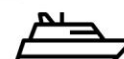

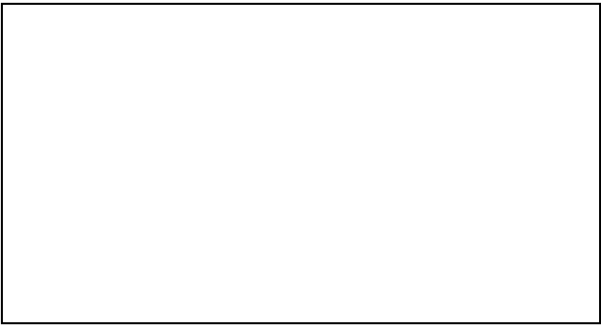

1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation.
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts.
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes.
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a

1. SERVICE CATEGORIES

N.B.: Specific functions will depend on local circumstances. Basic functions are described in the following paragraphs.

2. ACCESS CONTROL AT GFMS BUILDINGS

- a) Ensure that the control point is neat and tidy during shift changes.
- b) Inspect and test all facilities and equipment and report any defects to the Assistant Manager/ GFMS official present.
- c) Security staff shall be conversant with normal procedures and permits required to enter the point.
- d) Ensure that all visitors are issued with visitor permits.
- e) Security personnel to escort visitors to their destinations on site.
- f) Ensure that all GG-vehicles leaving the premises are authorized (gate pass).
- g) Ensure that all assets leaving the premises are authorized (gate pass)
- h) Be polite towards all persons at all times but do not deviate from fixed procedures.
- i) Perform searches on vehicles as specified in the Company (Contractor) operations procedures.
- j) In the event of any doubt or suspicion, contact the Shift Supervisor.
- k) Open the gate and allow the vehicle through if all requirements have been met.
- l) Report any irregularity noticed at the premises, in writing to Assistant Manager/ GFMS official present.
- m) Monitor movement within the premises through the CCTV system.

3. PHYSICAL SCOPE OF THIS SPECIFIC CONTRACT

The following facilities must be patrolled and secured:

- a) Office block
- b) Stores
- c) Boardrooms
- d) Ablution facilities
- e) Government Garage yard
- f) Parking bays

4. GUARD SERVICES (BOTH SITES)

- 4.1 This service relates to the guarding of assets in accordance with standard practices and procedures in the security industry.
- 4.2 All accommodation, facilities and services supplied to the Contractor by the GFMS shall be operated and maintained by the Contractor to the satisfaction of the GFMS. The offer shall include for such services and no extra payment will be made to this effect unless specifically allowed for in the Schedule of Quantities.

5. RESTRICTIONS ON THE ERECTION OF STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT

- 5.1. The erection, installation, or alteration by the bidder of any structures and/or equipment including movable temporary office accommodation units, which the bidder may wish to erect for administrative and supervisory purposes, in or on the site in terms of this contract shall be subject to written approval by GFMS.
- 5.2. No domestic housing facilities will be allowed on site.
- 5.3. The GFMS shall not be liable for any loss or damage to equipment supplied by the bidder due to theft, vandalism, or whatever reason. Any such equipment lost or damaged shall be replaced by the bidder at his/her own cost.

6. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS WITH REGARD TO PERSONNEL UPON SIGNING A CONTRACT.

- 6.1. All security personnel shall be properly trained and equipped for their duties and in possession of a security clearance from the South African Police Services (SAPS).
- 6.2. All security personnel shall be provided with uniforms and equipment necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 6.3. The bidder shall provide a list of employed personnel to perform functions or duties in connection with the contract.
- 6.4. The bidder shall inform their employees of any security measures required or to be adhered to in accordance with this contract, which GFMS may, from time to time, prescribe.
- 6.5. Where non-performance is observed from bidders key personnel, GFMS may exercise the right to report the matter to the company and demand a replacement. The replacement must possess the same requirements (experience and qualification) as per the bid document.
- 6.6. In such an event (as per 6.5 above), the bidder shall forthwith comply with the request and shall not on account of such request, be entitled to claim any loss or damages from GFMS.
- 6.7. Furthermore, if GFMS requires any information regarding any of the bidder's employees connected with the performance of functions and duties in terms of this Contract, the bidder shall without delay furnish GFMS with all available information upon request.
- 6.8. The bidder shall appoint personnel capable of communicating with members of the public in the language dominant in the area (OR Tambo).
- 6.9. GFMS shall be entitled to require the bidder forthwith to withdraw any employees from the relevant duty if such employee does not, in the opinion of GFMS, comply with a reasonable linguistic standard.

7. QUALIFICATIONS OF KEY PERSONNEL

The security staff employed by the Contractor at the site shall satisfy the following conditions:

7.1 Supervisors

- (a) Supervisors must be in possession of a valid Grade B level certificate from accredited security authority.
- (b) Supervisors must be in possession of a valid firearm competency certificate.
- (c) Supervisors must have a good understanding of their job descriptions and duties.
- (d) Supervisors must at all times be capable of leading/controlling and supervising their subordinates.
- (e) Supervisors must be able to communicate, read and write.
- (f) Supervisors must not be younger than 18 years of age.

7.2 Security Guards

- (a) Security guards must be in possession of a valid Grade C level certificate from accredited security authority.
- (b) Security guards must be in possession of a valid firearm competency certificate
- (b) Security guards must be able to communicate, read and write.
- (c) Security guards must not be younger than 18 years of age.

8. GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR SUPERVISORS AND SECURITY GUARDS

- 8.1 Supervisors and security guards shall have undergone and passed formal Security training approved by Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority (PSIRA).
- 8.2 At all times supervisors and security guards shall present an acceptable image/appearance which implies, inter alia, that they may not publicly sit, lounge about, smoke, eat or drink while attending to people.
- 8.3 Supervisors and security guards shall at all times present a dedicated attitude/approach to security, which attitude/approach shall imply, inter alia, that there shall be no unnecessary arguments with visitors/staff or discourteous behavior towards them.
- 8.4 Supervisors and security guards shall be physically healthy and medically fit for the execution of their duties.
- 8.5 Supervisors and security guards shall be registered as security officers/guards, as required by Private Security Industry Regulatory Act, Act 57 of 2001.
- 8.6 Supervisors and security guards shall sign an undertaking in which they declare that they will refrain from any action which might be to the detriment of GFMS.
- 8.7 Supervisors and security guards are prohibited from reading office documents or rummaging through records.
- 8.8 No information concerning GFMS's activities may be furnished to the public or news media by the bidder or his employees.
- 8.9. The GFMS reserves the right to ascertain from the South African Police Services whether security staff in his/her service possesses clearances, and to ascertain from the Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority (PSIRA) whether the security staff are registered with PSIRA.
- 8.10. The wages paid to security personnel must be at least the minimum wage according to the sector determination.

9. SECURITY STAFF EQUIPMENT

- 9.1. The bidder shall ensure that each member of his security staff will always when on duty be fully equipped in respect of:
- 9.2 A neat and clearly identifiable uniform from the bidder, which uniform will include matching raincoat and overcoats for rainy and cold conditions respectively.
- 9.3 A clear identification card with the member's photo and employee number, always worn on their persons.

10 SERVICE AIDS TO BE WORN ON THE BODY AT ALL TIMES:

- a) Baton
- b) Handcuffs
- c) Whistle
- d) Pocket Book
- e) Pen
- f) Torch (at night)
- g) Radio – Hand Carried 2 Way
- h) Handheld detector
- i) Firearm carried by competent security guards

11. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- 11.1 The bidder must provide a 24-hour service and electronic tracking of patrols to the Government Fleet Management Services on a weekly basis.
- 11.2 At his Headquarters, proper staff files of all security staff in his service that is employed for service shall be kept up to date by the bidder and be available for inspections by the GFMS. The appropriate documents shall include inter-alia, scholastic, registration and medical certificates and security clearances.
- 11.3 The bidder shall implement an approved control system such as a clock card to provide physical evidence of the presence of all employees on site at all times. Data sheets shall be supplied to the representative at his request and shall be submitted with payment certificates.
- 11.4 All employees shall be fully conversant with emergency plans and procedures on site and shall give their full support in the event of an emergency.
- 11.5 Employees shall not work for more than 12-hour shifts.
- 11.6 The bidder shall at all times provide the necessary supervision on site. This shall include a duly appointed Security Manager, Shift supervisors for each shift. Supervisors and Shift Supervisors may form part of the functional staff.
- 11.7 The bidder shall always have detail procedures manuals for all security functions available on site. Procedure manuals shall be submitted for the approval of the GFMS at the start of the Contract. Approval of the manuals will not relieve the bidder from any of his obligations under the Contract. Should GFMS discover any deficiencies in the Procedure Manuals subsequent to his approval of such Manuals, he may order the bidder to amend the Manuals to his satisfaction at the cost of the bidder.
- 11.8 The bidder must establish communication linkage with the police.
- 11.9 The bidder shall check authorization letters for the removal of goods from the GFMS premises.
- 11.10 Copies of the authorizations should be recorded and kept by the bidder.
- 11.11 Upon signing of Service Level Agreement, the bidder shall submit full particulars, including proof of training of all security personnel employed on site.
- 11.12 The bidder shall not remove such personnel from the project or employ new personnel on site without notifying GFMS.
- 11.13 Replacement of security personnel should be of the same grade.

12. TRAINING OF PERSONNEL

- 12.1 The bidder shall provide the necessary training programmes including initial and refresher courses to ensure that all personnel possess, at all times, the necessary expertise to execute their functions in accordance with the specification and to the satisfaction of the GFMS.
- 12.2 New personnel must be mentored by existing personnel to allow for a proper induction phase.
- 13.3 The bidder is responsible for the training of his/ her staff at the site in respect of the application of the guidelines of the emergency plan, which shall be provided to him/her by the GFMS.
- 13.4 Should any employee of the bidder not perform his duties to the satisfaction of the GFMS, the bidder shall forthwith remove such Employee from the site and replace him/her with an alternative competent staff member.
- 13.5 The GFMS may perform any tests, as they consider necessary from time to time to ensure that the service provided by the bidder is acceptable in terms of the specification. The GFMS or their representative will however not act as supervisors and any such tests or absence thereof, shall not relieve the bidder of his responsibilities under this Contract.

13. SUPPLY AND MAINTENANCE OF EQUIPMENT

All equipment including handheld metal detectors, radios and other communication equipment, vehicles, arms and ammunition and any other equipment necessary to execute this contract in accordance with the specification, shall be supplied and maintained by the bidder to the satisfaction of the GFMS and in accordance with the requirements of the National Key Point Act No. 102 of 1980 where applicable.

14. BACK – UP RESOURCES

The bidder shall provide adequate back- up resources to maintain security on the site.

15. REGISTERS

15.1 Security registers are to be supplied and kept neat and legible.

15.2 Occurrence Book: The purpose of the occurrence book is to give an overall picture of activities, inspections by supervisors, and all other relevant occurrences at the site.

The bidder's security staff on duty shall make the following entries in the occurrence book:

All listed routine procedures such as patrols undertaken, handing over of shifts, etc. mentioning the procedures followed, by whom and the time of commencement. These entries shall be made clearly legible, in blue/black ink.

- (a) All occurrences, however, slight or unusual, shall be recorded with reference made to the correct time and relevant actions taken.
- (b) All security staff activities, especially deviations in respect of the duty list, specifying particulars of the staff and relevant times.
- (c) The issue and/or receipt of keys, specifying the time and by whom they were received or delivered.
- (d) The unlocking or locking of doors or gates, specifying the time and by whom locked or unlocked.
- (e) The handing over of shifts, mentioning all names of all shift staff and accompanying equipment and aids. In this case, staff taking over as well as staff handing over shall sign the entry/entries.
- (f) After taking over of shifts, the first level supervisor shall make an entry declaring that he has read the Occurrence Book in order to acquaint himself with events that occurred during the previous shift.
- (g) All visits by second level supervisors and top management.
- (h) These entries shall be done in red ink.

Note: Under no circumstances may an entry in the occurrence book be erased, removed with correction fluid or totally deleted. It shall only be crossed out by a single line and initialed on the side. The bidder shall hand over all completed (full) registers to Government Fleet Management Services (GFMS) officials until the end of the contract.

16. VEHICLE CONTROL SHEET

To be completed by the night shift for all government vehicles on the premises. Day shift to check vehicles when taking over forms. Forms from previous day are to be handed in at the office before 08h00 the following day. GFMS is in the process of procuring mobile computers (scanners) for access control, security guards are expected to use the scanner for incoming and outgoing vehicles and drivers licenses.

17. FIREARM PROCEDURE FOR CONTRACT SECURITY

All handheld firearms and ammunition must be in the custody of the site supervisor and are kept in a locked safe. Handing over firearms is done on a daily basis using the firearm Register.

18. STORAGE OF VISITORS AND VEHICLE FORMS

The bidder shall hand over the fully completed visitors and vehicle control sheets to the project manager timeously for the duration of this contract, for Government Fleet Management Services to archive.

19. POCKET NOTEBOOK

The purpose of the notebook is to note down all incidents occurring, or observations made by a security person during a turn of duty, for later reference. During their turns of duty all security staff shall wear a notebook on their persons.

The following information shall be noted down in the notebooks: All occurrences/events however, slight, or unusual, referring to the following:

- a) Reporting on and off duty.
- b) Time of occurrence or event.
- c) Extent of occurrence or event.
- d) Relevant occurrence book number with due allowance for capturing follow up actions taken in respect of occurrence or event.
- e) All relevant information noted down in notebook shall immediately or directly after return from a patrol, be copied into the occurrence book.
- f) The bidder shall hand over the completed (full) notebooks to Government Fleet Management Services for the contract period.

20. DUTY LIST

- a) The purpose of the duty list is to serve as proof, at all reasonable times, that all staff who should be on duty per shift, are indeed on duty.
- b) Daily, weekly, or monthly duty lists of all security staff on duty, as purported in this agreement, shall be drawn up by the bidder and kept in the security control office of each site where such service is rendered.
- c) Any change to the duty list shall be crossed out by a single line, initialed, dated and noted in the occurrence book.

21. DUTY SHEET

- a) The purpose of a duty sheet is to ensure that all security staff on duty is familiar with the duties as required in this agreement.
- b) The bidder shall have a fully expounded duty sheet available per duty point at the site.

22. EMPLOYMENT CONDITIONS

- a) The company/ staff on site will be managed by the Assistant Manager.
- b) Bidder to make sure that a replacement is available should one of the team members be unable to report for duty, for whatever reason.
- c) The bidder should sign a confidentiality clause not to divulge any sensitive information with regards to GFMS.

- b) Pair of trousers/ skirts
- c) Safety shoes
- d) Socks
- e) Uniform hats/berets
- f) Jerseys
- g) Bomber jackets/blazers
- h) Rain suits
- i) Raincoats and overcoats
- j) PSIRA identification cards

All staff members must wear name tags, PSIRA cards and uniforms at all times as required.

24. SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT

- (a) The successful bidder will be required to enter into a service level agreement with GFMS.

1. DEFINITIONS

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

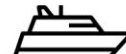
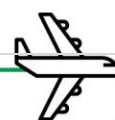
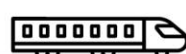
- 1.1 “Closing time” means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 “Contract” means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 “Contract price” means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 “Corrupt practice” means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 “Countervailing duties” are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 “Country of origin” means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7 “Day” means calendar day.
- 1.8 “Delivery” means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9 “Delivery ex stock” means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10 “Delivery into consignees store or to his site” means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11 “Dumping” occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12 “Force majeure” means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier’s fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.



- 1.13 “Fraudulent practice” means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 “GCC” means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 “Goods” means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 “Imported content” means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 “Local content” means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 “Manufacture” means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components, and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 “Order” means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 “Project site,” where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 “Purchaser” means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 “Republic” means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 “SCC” means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 “Services” means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 “Written” or “in writing” means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. APPLICATION

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and



the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.

- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. GENERAL

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. STANDARDS

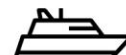
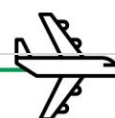
- 4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. USE OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION; INSPECTION

- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only as far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. PATENT RIGHTS

- 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

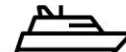


7. PERFORMANCE SECURITY

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations.

8. INSPECTIONS, TESTS AND ANALYSES

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.



- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. PACKING

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. DELIVERY AND DOCUMENTS

- 10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier.
- 10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified

11. INSURANCE

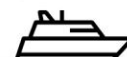
- 11.1 The services provided under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incurred on site. The service provider is required to provide proof valid insurance.

12. TRANSPORTATION

- 12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.

13. INCIDENTAL SERVICES

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any.



- (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
- (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
- (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
- (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

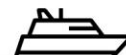
14. SPARE PARTS

14.1 As specified, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. WARRANTY

15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.



- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract

16. PAYMENT

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.

17. PRICES

- 17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. CONTRACT AMENDMENTS

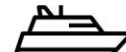
- 18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. ASSIGNMENT

- 19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. SUBCONTRACTS

- 20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the



original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. DELAYS IN THE SUPPLIER'S PERFORMANCE

21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.

21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall

evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.

21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

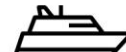
21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.

21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. PENALTIES

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the department shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the expected actual performance. The department may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

22.2 The service provider undertakes to be accountable for any losses incurred whilst the company is on site.



23. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

- (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2.
- (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

24. ANTI-DUMPING AND COUNTERVAILING DUTIES AND RIGHTS

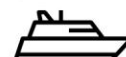
24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him

25. FORCE MAJEURE

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations.

under the contract as far as is reasonably practical and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.



26. TERMINATION FOR INSOLVENCY

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified.

27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,

- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or wilful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

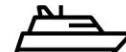
- (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs,

provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

- (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. GOVERNING LANGUAGE

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.



30. APPLICABLE LAW

- 30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified.

31. NOTICES

- 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. TAXES AND DUTIES

- 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.

33. NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL PARTICIPATION (NIP) PROGRAMME

- 33.1 The NIP programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34. PROHIBITION OF RESTRICTIVE PRACTICES

34.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor / s was / were involved in a collusive bidding (or bid rigging).

34.2 If a bidder / s or contractor / s based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Commission Act no.89 of 1998.

34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor (s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid (s) for such item (s) offered and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder (s) or contractor (s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder (s) or contractor (s) concerned.
